Education completed price to your previous March 31 expiration date will NOT be accepted. - 1. Complete the re-certification application you will receive in the mail, and mail it back to the NREMT with signatures and supporting documentation.
- 2. Go to **www.nremt.org**, fill out the on-line re-certification application, print it and mail it with signatures and supporting documentation.
